A word from our Pastor

My dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is hard to believe that January is already over. It seems to have flown by, perhaps in part to the extended football season that kept many of us on the edge of our seats. So here we are in February continuing our journey in the season after Epiphany, slowing heading towards Lent which begins in March.

Our Wednesday Bible study is exploring the Psalms, and my recent class sparked many ideas. We studied the richness of Psalm 95, traditionally linked to the Festival of the Booths, which commemorates Israel's exodus from Egypt—a theme I touched on in last week's sermon.

Psalm 95 declares the one true living God, highlighting His faithfulness and His people's unfaithfulness. Recognizing this, we see our Creator as worthy of worship. Our Bible study's author noted that "worship" was first a noun before becoming a verb implying a constant state of worship. This perspective deepens God's call for us to be Christ's light in all we do. Imagine being in a constant state of worship. At day's end, could you say your thoughts, words, and actions reflected joyful, triumphant worship of our sovereign Creator?

Read the Psalm and then consider these other questions from the author:

- When was a time you withheld worship from God?
- What has been one of your greatest moments of worship?
- What do you find encouraging, timely or convicting about this Psalm?
- Based on this Psalm, what are some different expressions of worship that we could incorporate into our worship?
- Do we have to be on knees to worship? What is the significance of kneeling? What does this gesture reveal about our hearts?
- How would you describe a harden heart? How does a hardened heart interfere with the worship of God?
- What else does this Psalm teach us about God? About ourselves?

So much depth in just 11 verses—what good stuff! If you're intrigued, join us next week for Psalm 51 as we explore forgiveness and reconciliation. Meanwhile, take time to sit with God and try being worship for a day. I'd love to hear how it goes!

Psalm 95

1 O come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation!

2 Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to him with songs of praise!

3 For the Lord is a great God and a great King above all gods.

4 In his hand are the depths of the earth; the heights of the mountains are his also.

5 The sea is his, for he made it, and the dry land, which his hands have formed.

6 O come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord, our Maker!

8 Do not harden your hearts, as at Meribah, as on the day at Massah in the wilderness,


9 when your ancestors tested me and put me to the proof, though they had seen my work.

IN THE SPOTLIGHT MISSION STUDY

Within the Presbyterian church, mission studies are typically conducted when a church is in transition, such as before calling a new pastor, to provide clarity on the congregation's mission and vision. The study helps inform the search for a new pastor by identifying the leadership qualities that best fit the church's needs.

Not only does it provide a comprehensive assessment of the congregation, its history, its strengths, and challenges, its demographics and its ministry areas, it also helps discern where God is calling the church in its community and beyond.

For the last several months, our Mission Study Committee worked extremely hard to gather information about our congregation, our membership, our financial position, and our community demographics. It evaluated current programs and opportunities for growth. Through this, an updated mission statement was created as well as possibilities for the future.

We are pleased to report that the Mission Study is now complete. The Session approved the 2024 Mission Study and the Scioto Valley Presbytery Commission on Ministry approved the study as submitted on January 27, 2025.
